The Salt Lake Tennis Club Moves to its Fifth Phase of Evolutionary Growth!

Phase One 1912-1933

The **Salt Lake Tennis Club** was founded in the summer of 1912 at the old Victory tennis courts at Second South and Tenth East. It was the second athletic club founded in Utah (The Country Club being the first).

Phase Two 1933-1956

In 1933, the Club moved to its 9th East location near Forest Dale Golf Course, with a new three-court facility that later added two more courts, a clubhouse, and bleachers and facilities worthy of presenting major tennis events. Originally built as clay tennis courts, several national tournaments were hosted at this prestigious club. World class players like Tony Trabert (father of current Tennis Manager--Mike Trabert) and Rod Laver played national tournaments and exhibitions at the Salt Lake Tennis Club during the 1940's and 1950's.



Phase Three 1957-1964

In 1957, Lee Hammel was hired as Club Manager and Tennis Professional. Under his leadership, a swimming pool was built that transformed the club from a sleepy tennis club searching for members into a vibrant family tennis and swim club with a waiting list.

In its beautiful setting, equipped with a fine, modern Club house and excellent courts, we can all join in making the Salt Lake Tennis Club a place of real attraction to tennis lovers in this area.

Phase Four 1964-2013

In 1964, under the leadership of Dave Freed, the Salt Lake Tennis Club moved to its current location on 17th East and became the **Salt Lake Swimming and Tennis Club**. It featured a total of 18 courts, including six indoor courts, making the Club the first indoor tennis facility west of the Mississippi River.

Lee Hammel's son, Laury, was the first janitor at this location - a position he proudly held (with some breaks) until 1971.

Phase Five 2013-present

In 2013, Laury Hammel purchased the new club and began rebuilding the tennis programs and planning for a health center expansion. The new Health Center opened up on May 5, 2017, with a new name: **Salt Lake Tennis and Health Club.**



















Salt Lake Tennis & Health Club Ribbon Cutting May 5,2017









As a result our club is once again known as the premier tennis club in Utah!




